# The Death He Died

Mark 8:27-38

### Mark 8:27-38

<sup>27</sup> Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, “Who do people say I am?”

<sup>28</sup> They replied, “Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.”

<sup>29</sup> “But what about you?” he asked. “Who do you say I am?”

Peter answered, “**You are the Messiah.**”

<sup>30</sup> Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him.

<sup>31</sup> He then began to teach them that **the Son of Man must suffer** many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. <sup>32</sup> He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

<sup>33</sup> But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. “Get behind me, Satan!” he said. “**You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns.**”

<sup>34</sup> Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: “Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. <sup>35</sup> For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. <sup>36</sup> What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? <sup>37</sup> Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? <sup>38</sup> If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them **when he comes in his Father’s glory with the holy angels.**”

## He Is the Sinless Man

### Mark 8:31

<sup>31</sup> He then began to teach them that **the Son of Man** must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again.

**Who Is He? The Son of Man.  
Sinless. Suffering the pain of human sin.**

### John 1:29

<sup>29</sup> The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Look, **the Lamb of God**, who takes away the sin of the world!

### Revelation 5:1-5

<sup>1</sup> Then I saw in the right hand of him who sat on the throne a scroll with writing on both sides and sealed with seven seals. <sup>2</sup> And I saw a mighty angel proclaiming in a loud voice, “**Who is worthy to break the seals and open the scroll?**” <sup>3</sup> But no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth could open the scroll or even look inside it. <sup>4</sup> I wept and wept because no one was found who was worthy to open the scroll or look inside. <sup>5</sup> Then one of the elders said to me, “Do not weep! See, **the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has triumphed. He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals.**”

### Revelation 5:1-5

<sup>9</sup> And they sang a new song, saying: “**You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain**, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation. <sup>10</sup> You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to serve our God, and they will reign on the earth.”

## He Suffers Sin to Save Us from Sin

### Mark 8:31

<sup>31</sup> He then began to teach them that **the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected** by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again.

**He is without sin and causes no suffering.**

### Hebrews 4:15

<sup>15</sup> For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been **tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin.**

**He suffers at the hands of sinful men.**

### Hebrews 2:14-15

<sup>14</sup> Since the children have flesh and blood, **he too shared in their humanity** so that by his death he might **break the power of him who holds the power of death**—that is, the devil—<sup>15</sup> and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death.

## He Will Make All Things New

### Mark 8:38

<sup>38</sup> If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them **when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels.**"

**He will judge the living at the dead.**

**His Kingdom will have no end.**

### Revelation 21

<sup>1</sup> Then I saw "a new heaven and a new earth," for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. <sup>2</sup> I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. <sup>3</sup> And **I heard a loud voice from the throne** saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. <sup>4</sup> 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." <sup>5</sup> He who was seated on the throne said, **"I am making everything new!"** Then he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true."
