

At the moment we are in quarantine, but we hope that the children will be able to go to school. We try to involve the children in the work at home, and to help us with different things. All the children have grown up. Time is like a king flying very rapidly. The children miss you very much and they all send you warm

I was so delighted, last week, to finally get to meet Zina (pictured at left) via video chat. She is our newest family member at Home of the Good Shepherd in Nisporeni, Moldova. [She's already been in our foster home for more than a year!] She was a bit shy, but very polite and happy to answer my questions.

I can't wait to be back in Nisporeni in person with our foster family there under the capable care of Vlad and Carolina Pogor. Vlad and Carolina tell us that they have been keeping very busy with homeschooling the children and keeping them occupied during the pandemic school shutdowns.



Vlad (pictured in above photo, center) has also been busy with the Roma (Gypsy) youth, including enlisting more young people in English language courses sponsored by FGCI. We currently have 12 young Roma children and teens taking formal courses in English. This will be a big advantage for their future work and educational opportunities. Vlad writes: "This was the last youth group I led in Vulcanesti. The teenagers are doing well, I have indeed seen radical changes in their lives. I am glad that we have a close and sincere relationship with them. We hope to make our home (Home of the Good Shepherd) a separate place where we can better work with young people from Vulcanesti. To learn to do different jobs. The youth send you greetings and hugs."

We prayerfully anticipate that flight restrictions will be lifted by summer so that Jeremy Befort and I and other staff and missions team members from the States will be able to travel to and lead Bible camps in Romania and Moldova. Please continue to pray that we will be able to enter Romania and Moldova soon.
