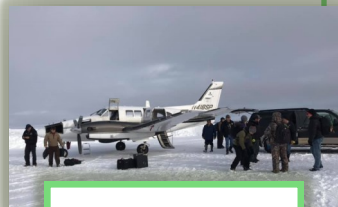
Prayer Requests:

5. **Financial.** For God to provide funds for an upright freezer, a generator, taxes we owe for 2018, and a down payment for a home.

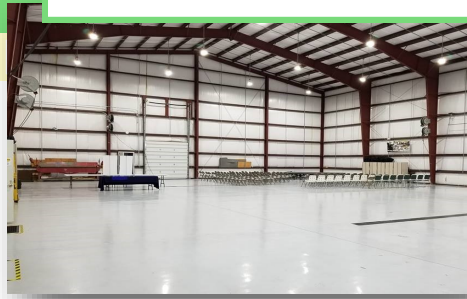

Unloading the plane

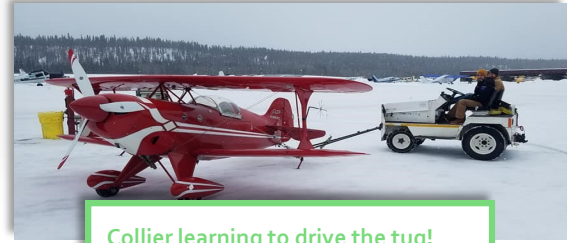


Hangar news!
